As a college student, she interned for then-Florida Congressman Adam Putnam on Capitol Hill and for Vice President Dick Cheney at the White House.

After college, she served as an assistant in the Wal-Mart Stores, Inc., federal government relations office and with the Washington office of Triadvocates, an Arizona-based lobbying firm. Upon returning to Florida in 2009, Kate served as a legislative coordinator with The Fiorentino Group, a Florida government affairs firm based in Jacksonville, before joining Excelined in 2012. She resides in Tallahassee.



#### Looking Ahead...


- Population to reach 26 million by 2030

- Need 2 million net new jobs by 2030




#### Florida's Electorate

#### The Legislative Environment

- 160 lawmakers
- 2018 Legislative Session: 60 days
  - ✓ January 9 March 9, 2018
- 3,200 bills filed vs. 200 bills passed in 2017 (6.25%)
- 1000 Trade Associations 15 major ones
- 1100+ registered lobbyists
- \$89 billion budget passed
- 2018 Constitutional Revision Commission
- Statewide Election Year





#### 2018 Legislative Session – Bills Passed

- \$89 billion budget
- School Safety & Hardening (Parkland)
- Hurricane Irma Relief and Reaction
- \$170 million tax cut package
- Opioid Restrictions
- Expanded Bright Futures and School Voucher programs
- Mary McLeod Bethune Statue in U.S. Statuary Hall
- Florida remain in Daylight Saving Time year-round
- Requiring nursing homes to have backup power sources
- Proposed Constitutional Amendments
  - ✓ Require 2/3 votes in House and Senate to pass tax increases
  - ✓ Cap non-homestead parcel assessments increases permanent
  - ✓ Increase property tax exemption value



## 2018 State Legislative Session – Top Issues

- Defeating Burdensome Regulations
  - Bill would have required all telecomms companies to automatically reimburse all outages in excess of 24 hours, regardless of reason
  - Costs estimated at tens of millions to industry
- Communications Services Tax (CST) reforms
  - Reviewing local share formula possible simplification
  - Debate surrounding taxation of video streaming services
    - Over-the-Top (OTT) carveout vs. everyone else
    - Presents significant fiscal impact to state (nearly \$1 billion)
- Monitoring and extinguishing potential threats
  - Alarm systems; Rights-of-Way; Privacy; New fees (trees)





#### **Federal Dynamics**

#### Trump Administration

- Appointed new FCC Chairman, Ajit Pai
- FCC adopted nearly 50 items in the first 100 days
- Obama-era rules on Net Neutrality, Privacy Reversed
- NCTA The Internet & Television Association
  - Advocating for legislative fixes on Net Neutrality, Privacy
  - Wireless spectrum wars
  - Rural Broadband
  - One Touch Make Ready (OTMR)





#### **Federal Messaging**

- Perception vs. Reality: phone's 80m subs vs. cable's 15m
- Internet different from water and electricity
- Private sector best-equipped to build, maintain broadband networks
- Regulatory certainty needed
- Our industry leads the way in technological innovation
- The Near Future is here now we need the networks to power it









#### **2018 Election Stakes**

#### Brace Yourselves: 2018 Election Poised to be Historic

- ✓ Five (5) statewide races, 3 with no incumbents, on ballot
- ✓ Four are statewide cabinet positions up for election
- ✓ Fifth race is for U.S. Senate Bill Nelson (D) up for re-election.
- ✓ Constitutional Amendments for consideration.

#### Result: Many Public Officials Running for Higher Offices


- ✓ Gov. Scott challenging Sen. Nelson for U.S. Senate
- ✓ Comm. Adam Putnam and Cong. Ron DeSantis GOP Gov. Primary
- ✓ Gwen Graham, Andrew Gillum, Philip Levine Dem. Gov. Primary
- ✓ Current and former legislators running for cabinet positions

- ✓ Even more races at district and local levels
- ✓ Record levels of campaign tv and radio advertising!


